Since then, he has spent numerous years working, studying, and lecturing in various Japanese cities, including Saitama City, Kobe, Tokyo, and Kyoto.

Among other projects and numerous publications related to Japan and Japanese literature, Dr. Angles' body of work includes recent English translations of books by poets Ito Hiromi, Tada Chimako, and Arai Takako.
